The parish pot hole scheme was being reintroduced and the gulley cleaners would be making more frequent visits. CCC had set aside £537,000 for rural improvements. He was looking forward to his upcoming year in office as Mayor of Colchester. As well as the usual business of the Council, ECC Cllr Bentley explained that following the recent uprising in Sudan, many of	

	the repatriation flights had arrived into Stansted and ECC had been instrumental in assisting with rehoming refugees where necessary. He also advised that the Home Office had announced that refugees from Afghanistan that were currently living in hotels in the County must leave the hotels by August. Those not having alternative accommodation will become the responsibility of the County Council. He was attended a site visit to the Weathersfield airbase later in the week where it is proposed to house 1700 asylum seekers.
