004/24	Report from the Chair of Abberton and Langenhoe Community Association Cllr Frost gave a brief history of the Village Hall. He noted the many activities that have been staged during the past year for residents. The monthly social evenings and weekly coffee mornings are very well attended and he thanked all the volunteers who work behind the scenes to make these events successful. During the year there has been new heaters installed in the Main Hall and new lighting and the kitchen has been updated. An application is being submitted to the Rural England Prosperity Fund for funding for solar panels.	
005/24	Report from Chair Lion Corner Community Shop Robert Davidson had been elected Chair this year and he thanked the previous members of the Management Team. There are now 60+ volunteers who work in the shop, but	

	more footfall is required to ensure its future. Income is currently approximately £10000 per month, but after overheads the profit is £1500 per month. The Community Fund will be reopening for local community groups to apply for funding. The children from Year 6 at Langenhoe Primary School are currently undertaking work experience at the shop.	
006/23	Report from the Hideout Youth Club Rachel Rosevear reported that the club was so successful that they now hold two separate sessions per month for Juniors and Seniors with a maximum of 30 children at each session. Funding had been secured from the Essex Community Fund which had enabled some taster sessions to be put on and local residents had offered their skills and services free of charge. The children are offered the opportunity to take part in many different activities and it is hoped to make more use of the outdoor area during the summer months. More helpers are always welcomed
